HAPPY 125TH BIRTHDAY SCRANTON LIBRARY!

We are thrilled to celebrate our 125th anniversary in 2025! The Library held its opening dedication on July 1, 1900 and was attended by over 400 guests on the front lawn of the Library. At that time, Mary Eliza Scranton opened the Library with 1,200 books; there are now over 100,000 volumes in our collection. The building was designed by noted architect Henry Bacon, who also designed the Lincoln Memorial.

In 1965 the Library added a two-story wing to the north and renovated the original building. More space was added in 1989 for book collections, seating, computers, and an expanded children's area. The 2020 construction and expansion doubled the Library's size to 34,000 square feet and provided more meeting and study spaces, a new Teen area, increased parking, and a Creative Loft in an energy-efficient space. Our modern library is now heated and cooled by an expansive geothermal system. We have over 50 items in our Library of Things and you can borrow innovative items such as an Ooni pizza oven, digital slide converter, telescope, or even a beach bicycle!

We are proud to have welcomed over 100,000 visitors last year. Patrons borrowed 194,000 items during the year and we issued more than 1,000 new library cards. There were over 1,000 programs held for all ages and they were attended by 24,000 patrons. We had over 10,000 community members use our study rooms and meeting spaces.

The Library is an integral part of the community and we look forward to serving you for another 125 years!

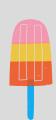
THE BOOK CADDY IS BACK!
