## CELEBRATING MADISON'S 200<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

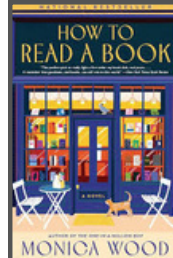
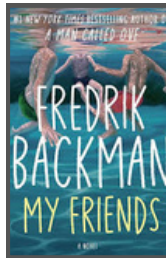
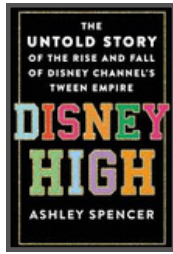
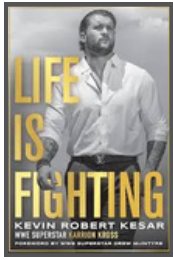
*Do you have a story to share?*

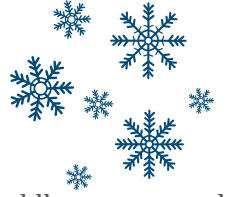
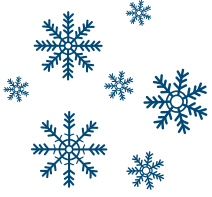
